DEMOGRAPHIC

15% of girls have been targeted by abusive behaviors online, compared to 6% of boys.1 Additionally, LGBTQ+ students experience cyberbullying at a much higher rate than their peers.





2 MENTAL HEALTH

Almost 70% of cyberbullying victims say online harassment has harmed their self-image.² Cyberbullying has also been linked to anxiety, depression, self-harm, and suicide.

PHYSICAL HEALTH

Cyberbullying victims are at increased risk of developing:

- Gastrointestinal issues
- Eating disorders
- Sleeping disorders
- Substance abuse



4 SCHOOL VIOLENCE

An analysis of 67 failed school violence plots reveals that most attackers were victims of bullying.3

In **21%** of cases, bullying was the primary motivating factor.
